

State Licensure

Each state has their own licensure requirements separate from Gupton-Jones College of Funeral Service's (GJCFS) graduation requirements. GJCFS's national accreditation with the American Board of Funeral Service Education (ABFSE) allows a student to sit for the National Board Examination (NBE) in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. However, some states may require additional education and/or specific college courses be taken prior to issuing a license. It is recommended that students review their state licensure requirements prior to and/or during their enrollment at GJCFS. All students should reach out to an academic advisor with questions about licensure so they may be directed to the proper person to assist them.

The information provided below denotes whether GJCFS's programs meet the funeral service education requirements for each state. It is not intended to indicate that our programs meet all the requirements for licensure. The AS column indicates whether the degree from GJCFS meets the funeral service education requirements for a combined funeral director/embalmer license in the listed state. An asterisk indicates that there may be additional education requirements. The name of each state is a link to where you may find the laws/rules/regulations for licensure for that state. It is recommended that you check with your state funeral service licensing board as regulations change frequently.

State Authorization

Please note that California does not participate in the National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA). Consequently, the California Higher Education Committee does not officially recognize an online educational program from an institution outside of California without prior approval. Gupton-Jones College of Funeral Service does not hold such approval, nor is it required. However, many California students have earned our accredited Associate of Applied Science degree and have successfully become licensed funeral service practitioners in California.
